so great is his faithfulness.

Old Testament Reading/First Reading - #6 Daniel 12:1-3

A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Daniel

At that time there shall arise Michael,

the great prince, guardian of your people;

it shall be a time unsurpassed in distress since nations began until that time.

At that time your people shall escape,

everyone who is found written in the book.

Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake;

some shall live forever,

others shall be an everlasting horror and disgrace.

But the wise

shall shine brightly like the splendor of the firmament,

And those who lead the many to justice

shall be like the stars forever.

Old Testament/First Reading - #7

2 Maccabees 12: 43-46

It is good and holy to think of the dead rising again.

A Reading from the Second Book of Maccabees

Judas, the ruler of Israel, then took up a collection among all his soldiers, amounting to two thousand silver drachmas, which he sent to Jerusalem to provide for an expiatory sacrifice. In doing this he acted in a very excellent and noble way, inasmuch as he had the resurrection of the dead in view;

for if he were not expecting the fallen to rise again, it would have been useless and foolish to pray for them in death.

But if he did this with a view to the splendid reward that awaits those who had gone to rest in godliness, it was a holy and pious thought.

Thus he made atonement for the dead that they might be freed from this sin.

The Word of the LORD

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Old Testament Proverbs 31: 10-13, 20, 25-31 A blessed wife & mother

A Reading from the Book of Proverbs

When one finds a worthy wife, her value is far beyond pearls.

Her husband, entrusting his heart to her,

has an unfailing prize.

She brings him good, and not evil, all the days of her life.

She reaches out her hands to the poor, and extends her arms to the needy.

She is clothed with strength and dignity, and she laughs at the days to come.

She opens her mouth in wisdom, and on her tongue is kindly counsel.

Her children rise up and praise her;

her husband, too, extols her:
"Many are the women of proven worth,
but you have excelled them all."

Charm is deceptive and beauty fleeting;

the woman who fears the LORD is to be praised.

Give her a reward of her labors, and let her works praise her at the city gates.

Old Testament/First Reading - #9 Ecclesiastes 3: 1-8, 11, 15

God has made an appointed time for everything.

A Reading from the Book of Ecclesiastes

There is an appointed time for everything,

and a time for every affair under the heavens.

A time to be born, and a time to die;

a time to plant, and a time to uproot the plant.

A time to kill, and a time to heal;

a time to tear down, and a time to build.

A time to weep, and a time to laugh;

a time to mourn, and a time to dance.

A time to scatter stones, and a time to gather them;

a time to embrace, and a time to be far from embraces.

A time to seek, and a time to lose;

a time to keep, and a time to cast away.

A time to rend, and a time to sew;

a time to be silent, and a time to speak.

A time to love, and a time to hate;

a time of war, and a time of peace.

God has made everything appropriate to its time,

and has put the timeless into our hearts.

What now is,

has already been;

what is to be,

already is;

and God restores what would otherwise be displaced.

New Testament/Second Reading - #1a - Long Version Acts 10:34-43

Jesus as the Divine Judge of the living and dead.

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Then Peter proceeded to speak and said, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him. You know the word (that) he sent to the Israelites as he proclaimed peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all, what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.

We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and (in) Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree.

This man God raised (on) the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name."

New Testament/Second Reading - #l b - Short Version Acts 10: 34-36, 42-42

Jesus as the Divine Judge of the living and dead.

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Then Peter proceeded to speak and said,
"In truth, I see that GoD shows no partiality.
Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him.

You know the word (that) he sent to the Israelites as he proclaimed peace through Jesus Christ, who is LORD of all.

He commissioned us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead.

To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name."

New Testament/Second Reading - #2 Romans 5:5-11

We will be saved and justified through his blood.

A Reading from the Letter to the Romans

Hope does not disappoint, because the love of GOD has been poured out into our hearts through the holy Spirit that has been given to us.

For Christ, while we were still helpless, yet died at the appointed time for the ungodly.

Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die.

But GOD proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us.

How much more then, since we are now justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath.

Indeed, if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to GOD through the death of his Son, how much more, once reconciled, will we be saved by his life.

Not only that, but we also boast of GOD through our LORD Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

New Testament/Second Reading - #3 Romans 5: 17-21 Where sin increased, grace abounded even more.

A Reading from the Letter to the Romans

Just as through one transgression, condemnation came upon all, so through one righteous act acquittal and life came to all.

For just as through the disobedience of one person the many were made sinners, so through the obedience of one the many will be made righteous.

The law entered in so that transgression might increase but, where sin increased, grace overflowed all the more, so that, as sin reigned in death, grace also might reign through justification for eternal life through Jesus Christ our LORD.

New Testament /Second Reading - #4a- Long Version Romans 6: 3-9

Let us walk in newness of life.

A Reading from the Letter to the Romans

Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?

We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.

For if we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection.

We know that our old self was crucified with him, so that our sinful body might be done away with, that we might no longer be in slavery to sin.

For a dead person has been absolved from sin.

If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him.

We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him.

New Testament/Second Reading - # 4b - Short Version Romans 6: 3-9

Let us walk in newness of life.

A Reading from the Letter to the Romans.

Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?

We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.

If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him.

We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him.

New Testament/Second Reading - # 5 Romans 8:14-23

I consider the sufferings of this present time as nothing.

A Reading from the Letter to the Romans.

Those who are led by the Spirit of GOD are children of GOD. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a spirit of adoption, through which we cry, "Abba, Father!" The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of GOD, and if children, then heirs, heirs of GOD and joint heirs with Christ, if only we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

I consider the sufferings of this present time as nothing, compared to the glory to be revealed for us. For creation awaits with eager expectation the revelation of the children of GoD; for creation was made subject to futility, not of its own accord but because of the One who subjected it, in hope that creation itself would be set free from slavery to corruption and share in the glorious freedom of the children of GOD. We know that all creation is groaning in labor pains even until now; and not only that, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, we also groan within ourselves as we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies.

New Testament /Second Reading - #6 Romans 8:31b-35, 37-39 What will separate from the love of Christ?

A Reading from the Letter to the Romans

If GOD is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all, how will he not also give us everything else along with him? Who will bring a charge against GOD'S chosen ones? It is GOD who acquits us. Who will condemn? It is Christ Jesus who died, rather, was raised, who also is at the right hand of GOD, who indeed intercedes for us.

What will separate from the love of Christ? Will anguish, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or the sword? No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of GOD in Christ Jesus our LORD.

New Testament /Second Reading - #7 Romans 14:7-12

Whether alive or dead, we belong to the Lord.

A Reading from the Letter to the Romans

None of us lives for oneself, and no one dies for oneself.

For if we live, we live for the LORD, and if we die, we die for the LORD; so then, whether we live or die, we are the LORD'S.

For this is why Christ died and came to life, that he might be LORD of both the dead and the living.

Why then do you judge your brother?

Or you, why do you look down on your brother?

For we shall all stand before the judgment seat of GOD;

for it is written:

"As I live, says the LORD, every knee shall bend before me, and every tongue shall give praise to GOD."

So (then) each of us shall give an account of himself to GOD.

New Testament /Second Reading - #8a -Long Version 1 Corinthians 15: 20-28

All will be brought to life in Christ.

A Reading from the First Letter to the Corinthians

Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead came also through a human being. For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order: Christ the firstfruits; then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ; then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to his GOD and Father, when he has destroyed every sovereignty and every authority and power.

For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death, for "he subjected everything under his feet." But when it says that everything has been subjected, it is clear that it excludes the one who subjected everything to him.

When everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will (also) be subjected to the one who subjected everything to him, so that God may be all in all.

New Testament/Second Reading - #8 b Short Version

1 Corinthians 15: 20-23

All will be brought to life in Christ.

A Reading from the First Letter to the Corinthians

Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.

For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead came also through a human being.

For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order:

Christ the firstfruits; then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ.

New Testament / Second Reading - #9

1 Corinthians 15: 51-57

Death is swallowed up in victory.

A Reading from the First Letter to the Corinthians

Behold, I tell you a mystery.

We shall not all fall asleep, but we will all be changed in an instant, in the blink of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed.

For that which is corruptible must clothe itself with incorruptibility, and that which is mortal must clothe itself with immortality.

And when this, which is corruptible, clothes itself with incorruptibility and this, which is mortal, clothes itself with immortality, then the word that is written shall come about: "Death is swallowed up in victory.

Where O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?

The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law.

But thanks be to GOD who gives us the victory through our LORD Jesus Christ.

New Testament /Second Reading - #10 2 Corinthians 4:13 - 5:1

What is seen is transitory; what is unseen is eternal.

A Reading from the Second Letter to the Corinthians

We know that the one who raised the LORD Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and place us with you in his presence.

Everything indeed is for you, so that the grace bestowed in abundance on more and more people may cause the thanksgiving to overflow for the glory of God.

Therefore, we are not discouraged; rather, although our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day.

For this momentary light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to what is seen but to what is unseen; for what is seen is transitory, but what is unseen is eternal.

For we know that if our earthly dwelling, a tent, should be destroyed, we have a building from God, a dwelling not made with hands, eternal in heaven.

New Testament /Second Reading - #11 2 Corinthians 1: 6-10

We have an everlasting home in heaven.

A Reading from the Second Letter to the Corinthians

For we know that if our earthly dwelling, a tent, should be destroyed, we have a building from God, a dwelling not made with hands, eternal in heaven.

So we are always courageous, although we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the LORD, for we walk by faith, not by sight.

Yet we are courageous, and we would rather leave the body and go home to the LORD.

Therefore, we aspire to please him, whether we are at home or away.

For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil.

New Testament / Second Reading - #12

Philippians 3:20-21

Jesus will change our mortal bodies to be like his own.

A Reading from the Letter to the Philippians
Our citizenship is in heaven,
and from it we also await a savior, the LORD Jesus Christ.

He will change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body by the power that enables him also to bring all things into subjection to himself.

New Testament/Second Reading - #13

1 Thessalonians 4: 13-26

Jesus is our hope.

A Reading from the Second Letter to the Thessalonians

We do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, about those who

have fallen asleep, so that you may not grieve like the rest, who have no

hope.

For if we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will GOD, through Jesus,

bring with him those who have fallen asleep.

Indeed, we tell you this, on the word of the LORD, that we who are alive,

who are left until the coming of the LORD, will surely not precede those

who have fallen asleep.

For the LORD himself, with a word of command, with the voice of an

archangel and with the trumpet of GOD, will come down from heaven, and

the dead in Christ will rise first.

Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them

in the clouds to meet the LORD in the air. Thus we shall always be with

the LORD.

Therefore, console one another with these words.

The Word of the LORD.

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New Testament/Second Reading - # 14 2 Timothy 2: 8-13

If we have died with him we shall also live with him.

A Reading form the Second Letter to Timothy

Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David: such is my gospel, for which I am suffering, even to the point of chains, like a criminal. But the word of GOD is not chained.

Therefore, I bear with everything for the sake of those who are chosen, so that they too may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, together with eternal glory.

This saying is trustworthy:

If we have died with him

we shall also live with him;

if we persevere

we shall also reign with him.

But if we deny him

he will deny us.

If we are unfaithful

he remains faithful,

for he cannot deny himself.

New Testament /Second Reading - #15) 1 John 3:1-2

We are always God 's children.

A Reading from the First Letter of John

See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of GOD. Yet so we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are GOD'S children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is.

New Testament / Second Reading - #16

1 John 3: 14-16

We have life because of love.

A Reading from the First Letter of John

We know that we have passed from death to life because we love our

brothers. Whoever does not love remains in death.

Everyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no

murderer has eternal life remaining in him.

The way we came to know love was that he laid down his life for us; so we

ought to lay down our lives for our brothers.

The Word of the LORD.

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New Testament /Second Reading - #17 Revelation 14: 13

Blessed are they who die in the Lord.

A Reading from the Book of Revelation

I heard a voice from heaven say, "Write this: Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on."

"Yes," said the Spirit, "let them find rest from their labors, for their works accompany them."

New Testament /Second Reading - #18

Revelation 20:11 -21:1

All the dead were judged according to their deeds.

A Reading from the Book of Revelation

Next I saw a large white throne and the one who was sitting on it. The earth

and the sky fled from his presence and there was no place for them.

I saw the dead, the great and the lowly, standing before the throne, and scrolls

Following the Homily

Reader: "Our response is, 'Lord, hear our prayer.""

- Many friends and members of our families have gone before us into the eternal kingdom; Lord, grant them an everlasting home, we pray to the Lord
- Many people die each day by violence, war, and famine. Lord, show your mercy to those who suffer so unjustly these sins against your love, and gather them in the eternal kingdom of your peace, we pray to the Lord
- Those who trusted in the Lord now sleep in the Lord. Give refreshment, rest, and peace to all whose faith is known to you alone, we pray to the Lord
- All of (*Name's*) family and friends seek comfort and consolation during this time of loss. Lord, heal their pain and dispel any darkness and doubt that come with grief, we pray to the Lord....
- We are assembled here in faith and confidence to pray for our brother/sister (*Name*). Lord, strengthen our hope so that we may live in confidence of your lasting peace through your Son's coming, we pray to the Lord....

Priest: Gracious God, giver of peace and healer of souls, hear the prayers of your Son and the voices of your people, whose lives have been purchased by the blood of the Lamb. Forgive the sins of all who sleep in Christ and grant them a place in your eternal kingdom. We ask this and all of our prayers through Christ, our Lord.

Priest: God, the almighty Father, raised Christ his Son and conquered death; with confidence we ask God to save all his children:

Reader: "Our response is, 'Lord, hear our prayer. "

- For <u>(Name)</u>, who in baptism was given the pledge of eternal life, that he/she may now be admitted to the company of all the saints, we pray to the Lord
- For our brother/sister who shared in the body of Christ, the bread of life, that he/she may be raised on the last day, we pray to the Lord
- For our deceased relatives and friends and for all who have helped us in our lives, that they may have the reward for their goodness, we pray to the Lord
- For all who have fallen asleep in Christ steeped in a faith only God knew, that they may know the joy of seeing God face to face, we pray to the Lord....
- For all of (*Name's*) family and friends, including those who could not be here, that all may be consoled in their grief by the Lord, who wept at the death of his own friend, Lazarus, we pray to the Lord
- For all who are experiencing loss due to separations of all kinds, that they may find comfort in Christ, we pray to the Lord
- For all of us assembled here to thank God for the blessings we've known in (*Name*), that we find comfort in our belief we will be gathered again in God's eternal kingdom, we pray to the Lord

Priest: Gracious God, who is our shelter and our strength, you listen to the cry of your people; hear our prayers for our deceased relatives and friends that they may know the fullness of joy in your presence. We ask this and all of our prayers through Christ, our Lord.

Priest: In our times of need and desperation, we turn to the Lord, the source of all blessings. Confident God is with us, we ask God to hear our prayers and tend to our needs:

Reader: "Our response is, 'Lord, hear our prayer. "

- For <u>(Name)</u>, who in baptism was given the pledge of eternal life, that he/she may be admitted to the communion of all the saints, we pray to the Lord....
- As (*Name*) proclaimed Christ's message by his/her daily living, we pray that we may follow his/her example, we pray to the Lord....

- That the dying, who await the embrace of Christ, may be freed from fear and filled with faith in the salvation God bestows, we pray to the Lord....
- That we, who assemble here to proclaim God's goodness in the midst of loss, may find strength in God's promises fulfilled in the resurrection of Christ, we pray to the Lord
- We are assembled here in faith and confidence to pray for our brother/sister (*Name*). Lord, strengthen our hope so that we may live in confidence of your lasting peace through your Son's coming, we pray to the Lord....

Priest: Gracious God, our shelter and our strength, hear the prayers we offer for our deceased brothers and sisters. Receive their spirit and may your love bring comfort to those who mourn their loss. We ask this and all of our prayers through Christ, our Lord.

Priest: We believe that Jesus died and rose again; and so it will be for those who die believing in him. God will bring them into eternal company with him, and so with confidence we offer our prayers.

Reader: "Our response is, 'Lord, hear our prayer. "'

- That as <u>(Name)</u> crosses the threshold of death to begin everlasting life, Jesus will be his/her guide and companion, we pray to the Lord....
- We pray for (*Name*), that as he/she knew creative labor, joy, and suffering here on earth, he may now share in Christ's risen life, we pray to the Lord....
- For relatives and friends who suffer this loss, this pain of separation, that our common faith, hope, and trust in God's love may be a strong support, we pray to the Lord
- For loved ones who could not be here, that the comfort of Christ is with them as well, we pray to the Lord....
- For all who suffer the pains of loss and suffering throughout our world, that Christ's resurrection may unite all of humanity, we pray to the Lord....

Priest: Almighty God of all consolation,

you have sent light into darkness in the presence and power of your Son. His death and resurrection have given us the victory over death itself.

Hear our prayers for <u>(Name)</u> and for all of the human family to know your consoling love. We ask this and all of our prayers through Christ, our Lord.
